

Pride = Downfall

- Most people think power is a great thing to have. It's actually dangerous. Consider Uzziah. As long as he sought the Lord, God made him to prosper, [2Chr 26:3-5](#).

(Note: "prosper" isn't about getting everything your way. It's about growing closer to God with your focus on Him instead of material things. It means you are able to bear trials with joy.)

- Unfortunately, Uzziah began doing things his prideful way. He didn't drive out the Philistines (picture of sin), [2Chr 26:6-10](#). He built cities among them (living in sin).
 - Have you ever struggled with pride?
 - Do you think your way is always the best, or do you ask God what He wants?
- He was so filled with pride that he presumed to burn incense at the altar which was not the role God had given him, [2Chr 26:15-18](#).
 - Do you serve God with joy wherever He has placed you or do you overstep your bounds?
 - Do you give God credit for anything you do well?
- What did God do to show Uzziah that He was angry with him, [2Chr 26:19-20](#)?
 - When you know God is displeased with you, do you confess and return to following Him, [Zech 1:3](#)?

How to Root Out Pride

1. Value servanthood instead of power, [Mark 10:42-44](#).
2. Confess your sin to God, [1John 1:9](#).
3. Find life in God's Word, [Isa 55:3](#).
4. Seek God with your whole heart for your whole life, [1Chr 28:9](#).
5. Don't do things apart from Jesus. The joy of the Lord is your strength, [Neh 8:10](#).
